There's also a super exclusive Black Metal classic reissue coming on vinyl that will have its very own Black City coloured variant - only available through us worldwide and super limited.



We were greeted by Sophie Wizard who was the best and we talked "shop" for a while whilst browsing the racks. If the super underground is your bag then COTW is the place for you. We



came away with a couple of albums we were aware of and two blind purchases - something we always try and do from time to time - along with a longsleeve and some other shop branded bits and bobs. Great little shop run by great people.

Next up to Highgate to visit Rise Above Records & Relics - the record store founded and set up by Rise Above main man, Lee Dorrian. We were served by the man himself, and after a brief chat about a beautiful condition copy of High Tide's 'Sea Shanties' we had our arm nearly twisted by (look this up for some

Both shops were beyond great and it was good to finally be able to visit which we will again soon.






Hails metalhead!

On 19th December 2022 the Bristol metal scene was shocked and saddened to hear of the passing of one of our own. The man behind Body Harvest (probably the best Death Metal band to come out of Bristol) and the up and coming outfit Cybervoid -Jake Etlle-Iles, known amongst friends and fans as Mettle.

We first discovered Body Harvest when we saw them play at Bristol Deathfest in 2016, before we had moved to the city and immediately fell in love with their immense technical ability and sheer brutality. Once we moved to Bristol in 2017 we caught them again at the launch of their 'Parasitic Slavery' album. It felt as newcomers to the city that Body Harvest were as integral to the Bristol metal scene as the likes of Jaguar and Onslaught who had gone before them.

When we opened the Black City in 2021 bands soon became customers who soon became friends and we were truly honoured that Jake was one of those. If there is one thing we will always remember about him it was that he literally never, ever, EVER stopped smiling. He had an infectious enthusiasm and buzz and lust for life that was apparent

lust for life that was apparent every time you saw him. He was a major talent, an incredible songwriter and performer but so much more than all of that - he was the nicest guy you could meet and someone we are proud and lucky to have had in our lives.

His picture is up in the shop and will remain there, and whenever we're felling a little low or down, just a glance at his face always makes us smile. You are dearly missed Mettle and you will never be forgotten. You'll always be with us. Rest in power... friend!
